

Attendance

As part of safeguarding, school monitors absence of all children. We recognise we have procedures in place for illnesses such as sickness which means children must be off school for 48 hours and how this could effect your child's attendance. Telephone calls, letters etc, are all recorded on our registers for monitoring of absence procedures.

School adopts Dudley's attendance policy and therefore must adhere to legislations set out by EIS (Education Investigation Services) and DFE. Part of the processes is to inform parents of low attendance and share schools concern. Any child with an attendance below 96% will receive a first letter. If over the following half term, a child's attendance doesn't improve a second letter will be sent out and a meeting arranged with parent/carer. Any attendance that falls below 90% is termed as 'persistent absentee'. School will refer these cases to EIS who will issue a fixed penalty fine and any further absences will be unauthorised until the attendance improves over 90%.
